

Juvenile Justice Learning Community: Residential Care and Behavioral Health

This meeting, the second in a series on the subject of juvenile justice and behavioral health, will provide participants the opportunity to think through how behavioral health needs can be identified and addressed in juvenile justice residential settings. Participants will learn about the use of behavioral health screening instruments and assessment processes in residential settings. Participants will receive a tool at the close of the meeting to help them inventory juvenile justice residential settings in their community and to assess tools and interventions currently used in those settings to identify and address behavioral health needs.
