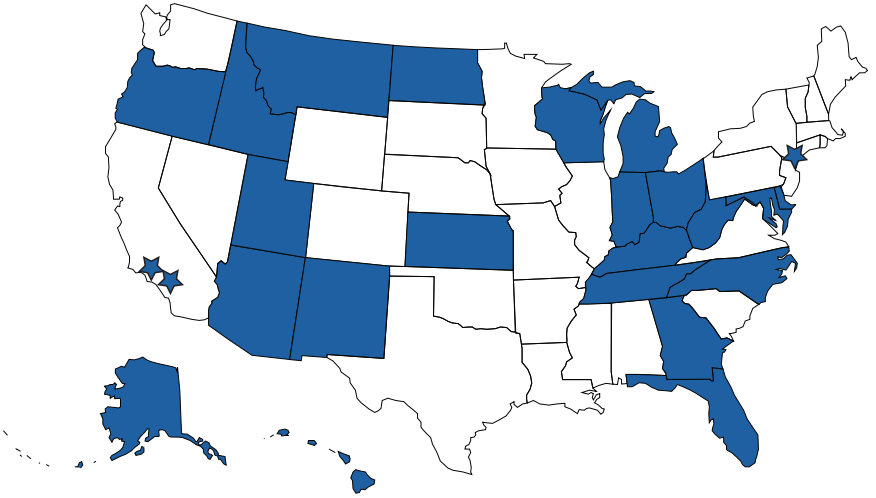


IMPACT OF THE MHTC-JJ

MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING CURRICULUM FOR JUVENILE JUSTICE

Since 2012, **930 people** from **24 states** have been certified as MHTC-JJ Trainers:

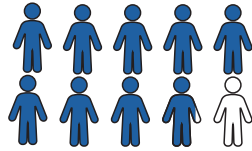

When asked about the quality of the Train-the-Trainer:

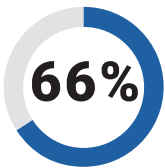


participants rated the program 3.39 out of 4

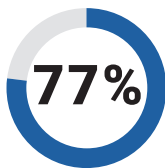


86% felt confident that they could deliver the training

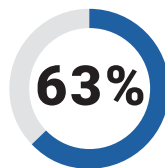
When juvenile justice staff who participated in a locally organized MHTC-JJ training were asked about the impact of the training:



reported making changes in their interactions with youth with mental health conditions



reported that their interactions with youth with mental health needs had improved



reported making changes in their interactions with co-workers around addressing the needs of youth with mental health conditions

Agencies in **14 different states** reported making policy/procedural changes related to addressing or responding to the mental health needs of youth in custody as a result of the training.
